

India-U.S. Trade Deal Faces Delays

India and the U.S. announced a comprehensive Bilateral Trade Agreement in February 2025, initially targeted for Fall 2025, but it has been delayed.

A comprehensive Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) between India and the U.S. aimed at enhancing trade and economic cooperation.

Article 253 of the **Indian Constitution** empowers **Parliament** to make any law for implementing **international treaties**, agreements, or conventions.

The **Ministry of Commerce and Industry** is the nodal ministry responsible for formulating and implementing India's **foreign trade policy** and agreements.

Bilateral Trade Agreements (BTAs) are pacts between **two countries** designed to promote **trade and economic cooperation**.

Non-tariff barriers are **trade restrictions**, such as quotas, embargoes, or sanctions, that are not **tariffs**.

The **BRICS nations** adopted the **Guwahati Declaration** to strengthen cooperation against **illicit drug trafficking**.

Under **World Trade Organization (WTO)** rules, the **Most Favoured Nation (MFN)** principle requires countries to treat all trading partners **equally**.
