

EAM Jaishankar Launches India's UNSC Campaign for 2028-29 Term

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar launched India's official campaign for a non-permanent seat on the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) for the 2028-29 term.

The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) is one of the six principal organs of the United Nations, responsible for maintaining international peace and security.

The **United Nations Security Council (UNSC)** consists of **5 permanent members** and **10 non-permanent members**.

The five **permanent members** of the UNSC are **China, France, Russia, the United Kingdom, and the United States**.

Non-permanent members of the UNSC are elected for a **two-year term** by the **UN General Assembly**.

India has served as a **non-permanent member** of the UNSC for **eight terms**, with the most recent being **2021-22**.

The **United Nations (UN)** was established on **October 24, 1945**, with its headquarters in **New York City**.

India is a **founding member** of the **United Nations**.

UNSC resolutions are **legally binding** on member states under **Article 25** of the **UN Charter**.
